What helped – Garnham Review


- Council previously commissioned an independent review of events
- Understanding the politics
- Recruiting the right person
- Demonstrating clear leadership
- Agreed governance with Deputy Leadel

Rochdale

Was it a waste of time?

What was important?

- Keeping Calm
- Doing nothing that could contaminate process
- Agreement with new Leader
- Getting the right team
- Building strong working relationships



When IICSA commenced

- Learned from what didn't work well in Garnham review
- Setting clear structure, records management, governance and regular review processes
- Monitoring spending
- Planning
- Importance of a well balanced team
- Building a positive working relationship with SA

Willingness to challenge

What hasn't helped?

- Problems mainly external
- IICSA team do they get it?
- IICSA's loss of reputation and delays due to their 2016 crises

Rochdale

- Real life core team holidays at critical time
- Costs
- Difficult getting all parts of council to buy in at pace
- High levels of duplication
