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Background

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Selection for Review

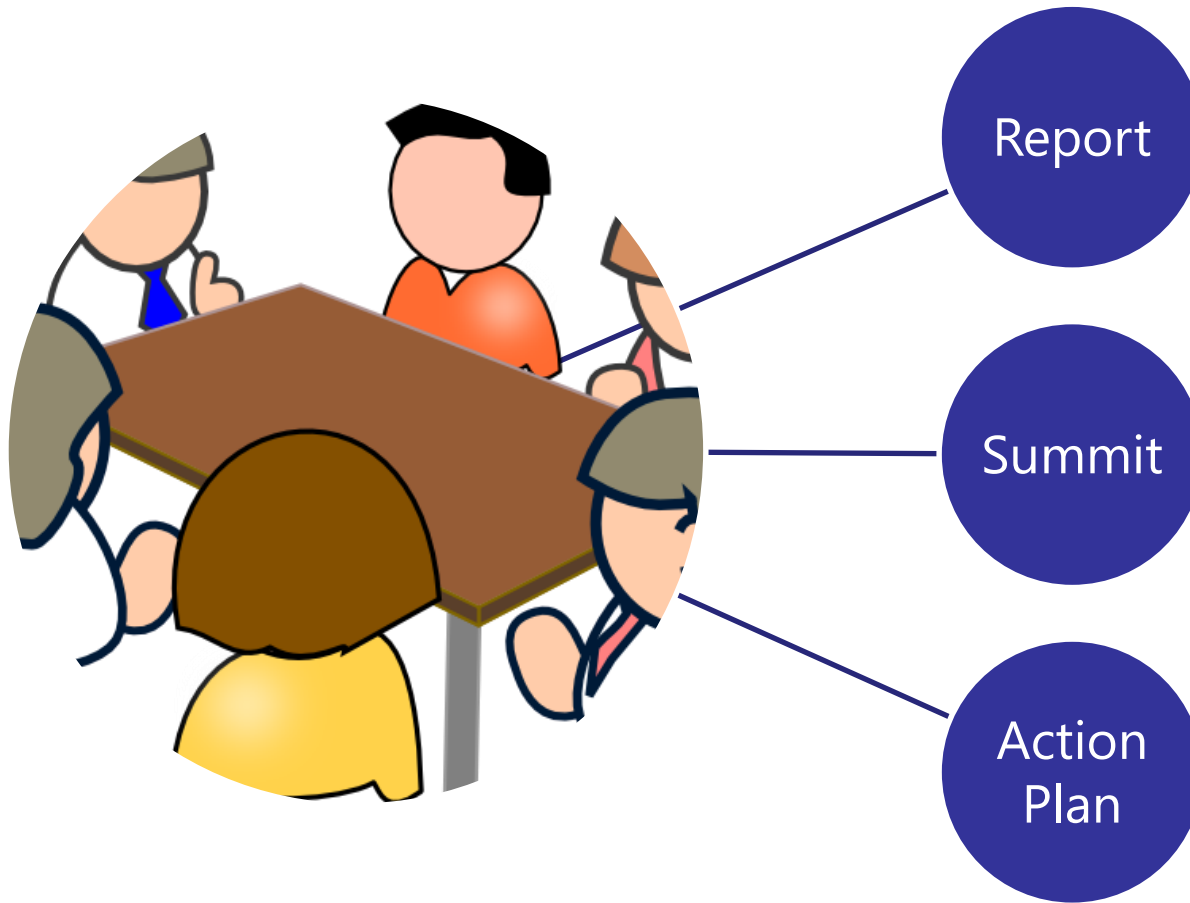
Six performance metrics were chosen to indicate how well Health and Social Care were working together in each Local Authority area. How each area was performing in respect of these metrics contributed to the selection for review.

- Emergency Admissions (65+) per 100,00 65+ population (March 2016 – Feb 2017)
 - 28,341
- 90th percentile of length of stay for emergency admissions (65+) (March 2016 – Feb 2017)
 - 23
- Total delayed days per day per 100,000 18+ population (Feb – April 2017)
 - 19.6
- Proportion of older people (65+) who were still at home 91 days after discharge from hospital into reablement/rehabilitation services (2015/16)
 - 63.3%
- Proportion of older people (65+) who are discharged from hospital who receive reablement/rehabilitation services (2015/16)
 - 3.1%
- Proportion of discharges (following emergency admission) which occur at the weekend (Oct 2015 – Sept 2016)
 - 18.7%
